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1. What Is Moodle?

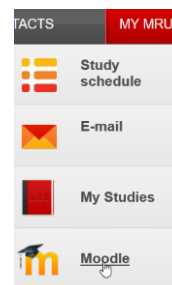
Moodle is a learning management system or e-study platform that allows teachers and students to work collaboratively online. Students are able to find learning material, participate in forums or “chats”, video conferences, take a test or exam, submit assignments, use the calendar, send messages.

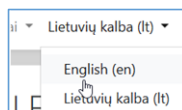
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2. Logging into Moodle

1. Go to <http://www.mruni.eu/en/> .
2. Click on the link that says **MY MRU**.
3. Choose **Moodle**.
4. Enter your login information (username and password).
5. Use the same username and password as MRU student email account's.



6. Change interface language here



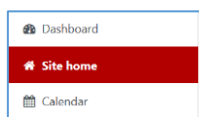

3. Enrolling on a Moodle course

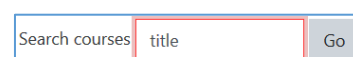
After you log in, your home page displays all of the courses – Dashboard - in which you are enrolled as a student. To enter the course, click the name of the course.

If you are not enrolled on correct course, complete the following steps for enrolling on.



1. Go to Site home.

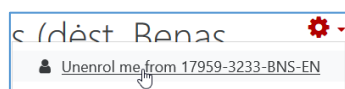
2. Enter name of the course or lecturer's name in the Search field.



3. Find the course name and click it, enter Enrolment key if needed and click **Enrol me** (ask lecturer for the enrolment key).

4. How do I unenrol from the course?

1. Enter the course from your Dashboard.
2. Click Action menu on the top right corner and click Unenrol me from...




3. Confirm that you want to be unenrolled from the course by clicking

Continue



Note: You can't unenrol from courses that you have been obligatory enrolled on.


4. Submit an Assignment

Moodle assignments  are shown on the course main page. Click on the assignment link and submission page will show the assignment deadline and further details.

The steps for submitting an assignment depend on the settings chosen by your lecturer.

- To submit a file in an assignment you should click on the assignment link. The assignment submission page will open (1). You should read the directions given by your lecturer and drag and drop your file(s) into the **Files** area, or browse for the file to upload by clicking on **Add submission** and

 **submission** and . Finally, you should click **Save changes** to confirm (2).

- For text only submissions, you should click on the assignment link from main course page, click **Add submission** and type into the **Online** text box. Save changes.


You may be able to read, edit and re-submit your assignment type depending on the settings your lecturer has chosen. You may be required to accept a submission statement, indicating that you are submitting your own work.

5. Using the Forums

You can use forums to discuss topics selected by your lecturer. Enter the course from the Dashboard.

Post to a Forum

1. Click the link to the forum you wish to review  Forum
2. Read the topic of the discussion or directions.
3. Click on the **Add a new discussion topic**.
4. Type a subject of your topic in the subject line.
5. Type your message text.
6. Upload file if needed.
7. Click the **Post to forum** button.



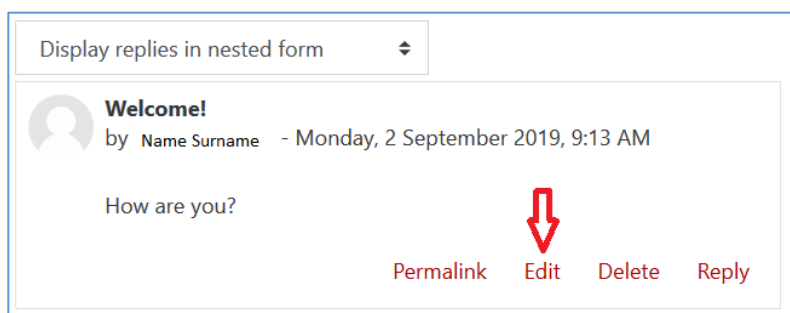

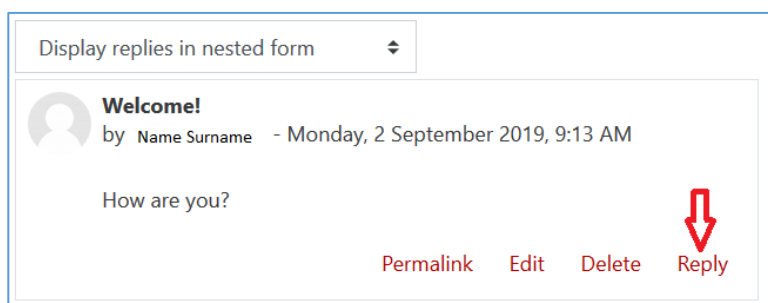

2. Click on the **Replay** link at the bottom of the post.

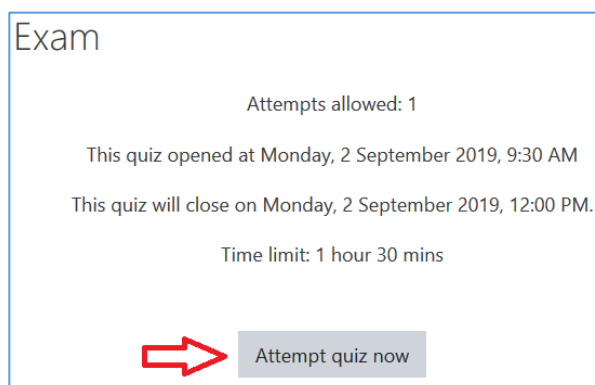


3. Write your reply into the box and click .

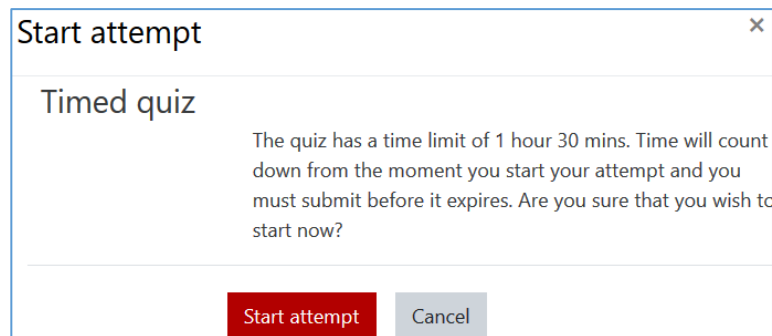
6. Taking the Test

The Quiz module enables lecturer to create online test, exam with a wide range of question types and overall options.

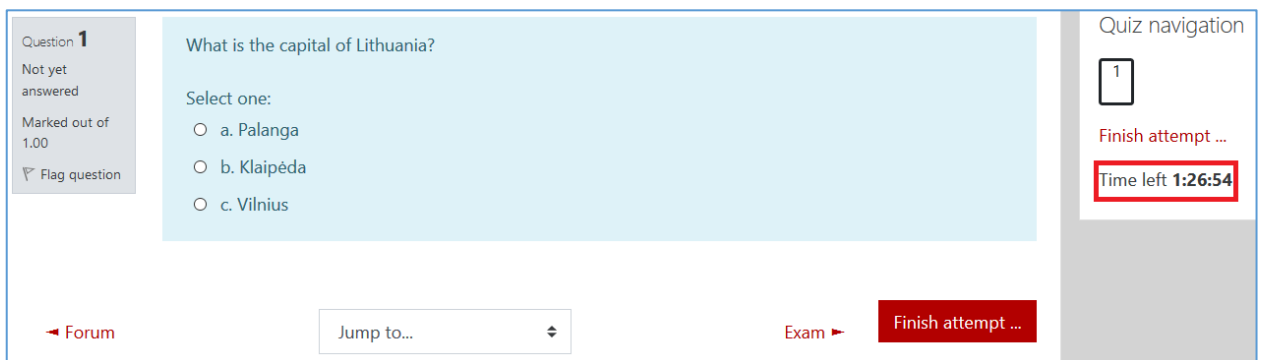
1. Enter the course from your Dashboard.
2. Find Quiz link  on the course main page.
3. Read any information provided by your lecturer. When you are ready to start the quiz, click the **Attempt Quiz Now** button as shown below:



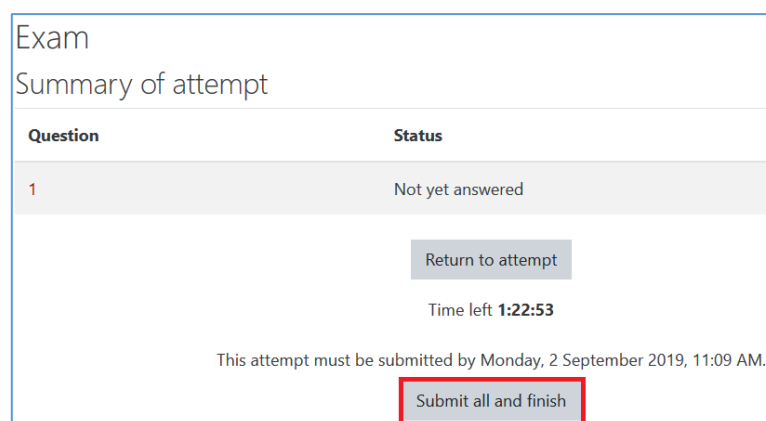
4. If your test is timed, you will receive a pop-up message requesting your confirmation of independent completion of the assignment and understanding that, test is limited to certain duration and attempts. You will need to click **Start attempt** to continue with the test.



5. You will see a screen similar to the one below after confirmation. Timer let you know how much time is left for you to submit the test. If you click **Next** you can navigate to the next question. By clicking **Finish attempt** you are one step closer with finishing answering the quiz questions.



After you are done you will need to click **Submit all and finish** button to confirm the answers.





Depending on how your test is set up, you may see your grade immediately upon finishing or you may need to go to your grade book to see your grade.

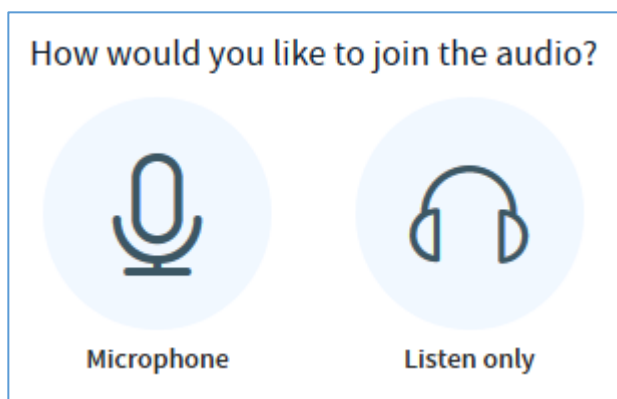
7. Virtual lecture

Virtual lecture enables students view and listen to presentations, ask questions, participate in group conversations. Here's a short video of how to use Virtual lecture

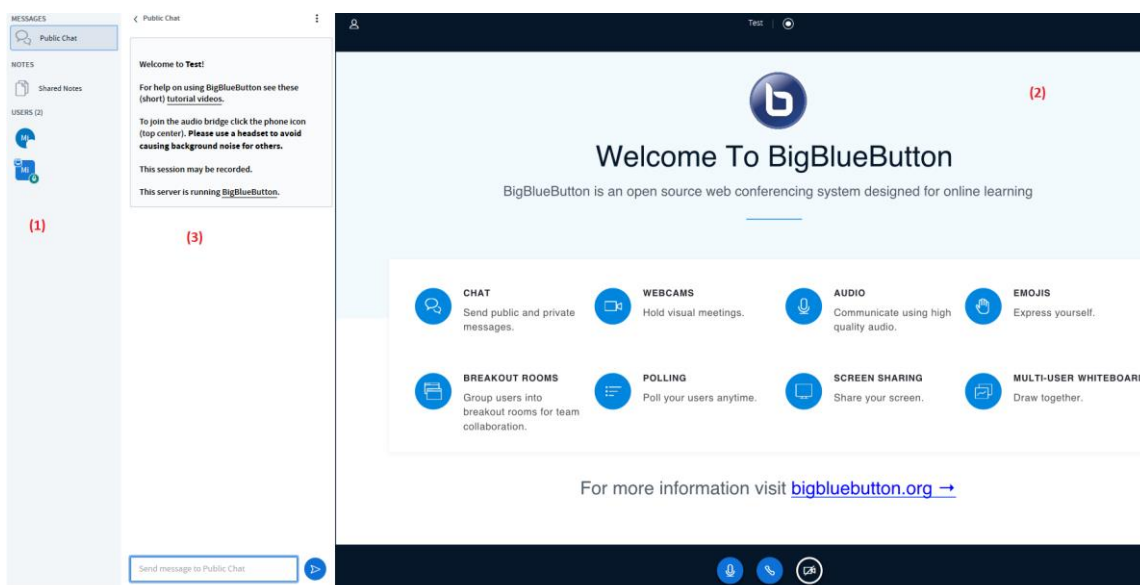

Note: Use *Chrome* or *Mozilla Firefox* as browser.

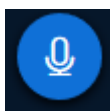
1. Enter the course from your Dashboard.
2. Click on the link marked as  .
3. Click  when lecturer has started virtual lecture.
4. Choose how you would like to join the audio. It's recommended to use Microphone and mute it till you need to talk or Listen only to avoid echo during virtual lecture.



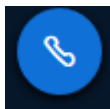
Once you have entered the virtual room, modules will appear in the main interface: users (1), presentation (2), chat (3). The lecturer's webcam will be seen only if he/she chooses to share it.



The main buttons:



- to Mute the microphone.



- to leave the Audio.



- to join/rejoin the Audio. Set up and join the microphone and speakers.



- to share the webcam.

Logout form the virtual lecture by clicking 3 dots in the top right corner
